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INTRODUCTION TO THE EPISTLE TO THE HEBREWS

PURPOSE FOR WRITING

- A. "The primary object of our author in writing this Epistle was manifestly to persuade his Hebrew brethren in Christ to preserve to the end in their begun Christian course; and not to fall back again to Judaism...and it was therefore also for our comfort, encouragement and consolation, as well as for the benefit of the persecuted and disponding Hebrew Christian." (Robert Milligan)
- B. *"The principle aims of the writer are to establish the supremacy of Christ and Christianity..."* (Henry Thiessen, Introduction to the New Testament, p. 304)
- C. The central theme of Hebrews is "the superiority of Christianity over Judaism." (Frank Van Dyke)

DATE OF WRITING

- A. Some expressions within the book indicate that it was written quite some time after the day of Pentecost.
 1. Hebrews 5:12; 10:32-33
- B. Some expressions within the book indicate that it was written before the destruction of the temple in Jerusalem in A.D. 70.
 - 1. *Hebrews* 8:4; 10:11 (indicates the continuance of Judaism...)
 - 2. *Hebrews 10:24-25, 27* destruction seems to be close at hand....

C. Some dates & locations that have been suggested.

- 1. A.D. 67-69 (Henry Thiessen)
- 2. A.D. 63 at Rome. (Robert Milligan)
- 3. A.D. 62-70 (Pulpit Commentary)
- 4. A.D. 63 in Italy, probably Rome (Barnes)

D. Quoted in A.D. 95 by Clement of Rome

AUTHOR

A. Much controversy over who wrote the book of Hebrews.

B. Some accept Paul as the author....

- 1. Reference to Timothy, Paul's long-time associate (13:23)
- 2. Similarities in language used here & in epistles of Paul
- 3. Centrality of the person & work of Christ characteristic of Paul's writing
- 4. The writer may be in prison in Rome. (*10:34; 13:19, 24*)

C. Some reject Paul as the author....

- 1. Writer does not mention his name, whereas Paul always does in the recognized Pauline epistles.
- 2. *Hebrews 2:3* seems to make the author dependent upon those who heard the Lord, whereas Paul declares his absolute independence of man in his message to the Galatians (1:11-24)
- 3. Style differs from Pauline epistles.

D. Conclusions of some regarding the book of Hebrews and the apostle Paul.

- 1. Dionysius of Alexandria quoted it as an epistle of Paul & the those at Constantinople generally accepted it as written by Paul.
- 2. 'It is important to know that there is no doubt of its divine inspiration and indispensability in the canon." (J.M. Powell)
- 3. Clement of Alexandria named Paul as the author (A.D. 150-215), but argued that Luke translated the Greek.
- 4. Origen (A.D. 185-253) concluded that the thoughts were those of Paul but that the phraseology & composition were those of someone who was recalling the apostle's teaching (Clement of Rome or Luke)

E. Others who have been proposed as author.

- 1. Barnabas (suggested by Tertullian)
- 2. Apollos (suggested by Luther)
- 3. Philip the evangelist (suggested by William Ramsay)
- 4. Priscilla & Aquila (suggested by Adolf von Harmack)

JESUS, THE SON OF GOD Hebrews 1

Writer starts out with a look at Jesus, the Son of God... Emphasis is placed on the superiority of Christ... Compares Him to those of the Old Testament , and to the angels... Shows the great works of the Christ...

CHRIST, THE WORD PROCLAIMED & PROCLAIMER (1:1-2)

A. God spoke in Old Testament times (1:1)

- 1. **Deuteronomy 10:4** 10 commandments on tablets of stone...
- 2. *Exodus 25:16-22* the holy of holies...
- 3. *Hebrews 1:1* various times & ways through the prophets...
 - a. Visions Isaiah; Ezekiel; Obadiah; Nahum; Amos 7:1; Habakkuk
 - b. Conversation *Jeremiah 1:1-6*
 - c. Ezekiel 2:3, etc ".the word of the Lord came to me..."
 - d. *Hosea 1:1-2; Joel 1:1; Jonah....*

B. God speaks in New Testament times (1:2)

- 1. Deuteronomy 18:15 by His Son 1:2, 2:2-3, Matthew 17:5
- 2. The Word of God *John 1:1, 14, 18; Revelation 19:13*
 - a. New tablet, the heart 2 Corinthians 3:3; Psalm 119:11
 - b. New Tabernacle God dwells with the people (later lesson)
 - c. New Covenant *Hebrews 8:10-11* an intimate covenant....

C. A greater Prophet has spoken in the last days

- 1. Christ is greater than Moses... John 1:17; Galatians 3:10-13; Hebrews 3:1-4
- 2. Christ is greater than Jonah... *Matthew* 12:41
- 3. Christ is greater than Solomon... *Matthew* 12:42
- 4. Christ is greater than Elijah/the prophets... *Matthew* 17:3ff
- 5. Christ is greater than all the patriarchs *John 4:12; John 8:53*

CHRIST, THE CREATOR & SAVIOUR (1:2-3)

A. Heir of all things (1:2, 4)

1. All things are His... - John 16:15; Colossians 1:15-18

B. Maker of all things (1:2, 10ff)

1. Jesus is the Creator of all things... - John 1:1-3; Colossians 1:15-17

C. Express Image of the Person of God (1:3)

- 1. Jesus has been begotten of the Father... John 1:14
- 2. Jesus has shown us the Father... *John 14:9-10*
- 3. He is God 2 Corinthians 4:4-6; Philippians 2:6-8; Colossians 2:9

D. Purger of Sins (1:3)

1. The Saviour, who removes our sin - *Hebrews 9:12-14; John 1:29; 1 John 1:7*

CHRIST, GREATER THAN THE ANGELIC HOSTS (1:4-14)

- A. "You are My Son, today I have begotten You." (1:5)
 - 1. <u>BEGOTTEN</u> {gennao}
 - Strong's to procreate, to regenerate; bear, beget, be born, bring forth, conceive, be delivered to, gender, make, spring (Strong's)
 - 2. Matthew 1:18 "...she was found with child of the Holy Spirit."
 - 3. *Luke 1:35* overshadowing of the Holy Spirit
 - 4. None other are a Son as He is...

B. 'Let all the angels worship Him...''(1:6)

- 1. <u>WORSHIP</u> {proskuneo }
 - Strong's 1) to kiss the hand to (towards) one, in token of reverence
 2) to crouch, prostrate oneself in homage, reverence, worship...
- 2. *1 Peter 3:22* all things have been made subject to Him...
- 3. *Revelation 5:11-12* the angels worshiping the Son...

C. "Your throne, O God, is forever and ever..."(1:8)

- 1. <u>GOD</u> {*theos* }
 - a. Almost exclusively used in reference to the one true God...
 - i. Only exception is dealing with Greek gods/ deity Acts 14:11; 19:26; 28:6; 1 Corinthians 8:5; Galatians 4:8
- 2. Jesus is indeed God, the one true God...
- 3. *Hebrews 3:3-4* Jesus, God the builder...
- 4. Isaiah 7:14; 9:6 Isaiah wrote of Jesus as God...
- 5. *Matthew 1:23 "...God with us..."*
- 6. John 10:30-33 the Jews understood He claimed to be God...
- 7. John 20:28 Thomas confesses Him as Lord & God...
- 8. *1 John 5:20* the one true God...
- 9. Zechariah 12:1, 10 Jesus/Jehovah pierced...
- D. 'Sit at My right hand...'

1. **<u>RIGHT HAND</u>** {*dexios* }

—Strong's — the right hand, the right side;

metaphorically - a place of honour...

- 2. *Hebrews 1:3* at the right hand of Almighty
- 3. *Hebrews 10:12* obeyed and now has rest...

E. No longer sent forth....

- 1. In times past, He was sent forth...
 - a. Days of Lot, Ahraham, Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach, Abednego, etc.
 - b. In the days of His flesh *Matthew 10:40; Luke 4:43; John 3:17; 5:36*
 - c. He was sent to the cross for sin *Hebrews 9:28*
 - d. Now seated at the right hand of God; rest...
- 2. Angels are ministering spirits sent forth to minister...
 - a. Acts 5:19 apostles freed by angel of the Lord...
 - b. *Acts 10:3* angel with Cornelius...
 - c. *Hebrews 1:14* angels sent forth to care for the people of God...
 - d. *Matthew 18:10* their angels....

CONCLUSION

- 1. Writer has begun on the mission of his epistle...
 - a. Superiority of Christ & Christianity...
 - i. The law in the New Testament is greater than that of the Old Testament in its source & power....
 - ii. The Creator Himself has dwelt with us & ministered to us...
 - iii. Christ's deity has been established, He truly is God...

JESUS, THE SON OF MAN Hebrews 2

Hebrews writer presents to us Jesus, the Son of man....

Though He is God, He made Himself man to save man...

Jesus in coming to earth did not become 50 % man, was 100 % man...

THE GREAT SALVATION AVAILABLE (2:1-4)

A. Give the more earnest heed

- 1. Recognizes the possibility of falling away... v 1 ...thus,
- 2. The importance of the Word of God ν 2-3
 - a. "...word spoken through angels...."- Psalm 68:17; Acts 7:53
 - b. The new message is greater, for it was spoken by the Lord Himself!

B. Witnesses to this great salvation

- 1. Spoken by the Lord...
- 2. Confirmed by the apostles *John 15:27; Mark 16:20*
- 3. Confirmed by God, via signs, wonders, miracles, gifts of the Spirit...

MAN, LOWER THAN THE ANGELS (2:5-10)

A. The glory of mankind

- 1. We shall be glorified with Christ (no longer lower than the angels)
 - a. Testimony of David *Psalm 8*
 - i. God has deep concern/care for man...
 - ii. God has crowned man with glory & honour...
 - iii. Man had been appointed by God to rule...
 - X Over creation *Genesis 1:26-28*
 - **X** In eternity *Revelation 22:4-5*
 - X We shall be transformed to His image 2 Corinthians 3:17-18; Philippians 3:20-21; 1 Corinthians 15:49
 - iv. Our glory not yet given....

B. The glory of Christ

- 1. "...but we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels..."
 - a. Jesus became a man...
 - b. He suffered in the place of all...
 - i. He tasted death that all might taste life and reign..
 - ii. Our glory & honour are because of Him...
- 2. **v** 10 we have been brought to glory by Him...
 - a. He was made perfect through suffering...
 - i. We are made perfect by His suffering...

JESUS, MADE LIKE HIS BRETHREN (2:11-18)

A. He is not ashamed to call us brethren

- 1. We have been made one in Christ, we are brethren...His brethren....
 - a. He is not ashamed to call us brethren...
 - i. We are His body...His bride...His church...
 - ii. He will declare to us the things of God v 12-13
 - iii. He will confess us before the Father *Matthew 10:32-33*

B. As we are flesh and blood, He shared in the same

- 1. Jesus became flesh & blood v 14
 - a. The Word became flesh *John 1:14; 1 Timothy 3:16; Hebrews 10:5*
 - b. He came in the likeness of men *Romans 8:3; Philippians 2:5-8*
- 2. Victory is found in His death 1 Corinthians 15:54-55; 2 Timothy 1:10
 - a. His death destroyed him who had the power of death *Hosea 13:14*
 - b. His death gave freedom from bondage to death *Isaiah* 25:8

C. The Helper of mankind

- 1. "...Gave aid to the seed of Abraham..."
 - a. He did not need to take on the nature of angels...
 - b. Rather, He took on the nature of men to save men from sin...
- 2. "...Therefore, in all things He had to be made like His brethren..."
 - a. Born of woman *Galatians 4:4*
 - b. Increased in wisdom & stature as He grew up *Luke 2:52*
 - c. Endured temptation *Hebrews 4:15*
 - d. Had human feelings (pain, joy, sorrow, sadness, weariness, etc.)
- 3. "...That He might be a merciful & faithful High Priest..."
 - a. He is able to sympathize with us *Hebrews 4:15*
 - b. Being in our likeness, He is able to be our High Priest *Hebrews 5:1-6*
- 4. "...He Himself has suffered, being tempted..."
 - a. Hebrews 4:15 "...tempted as we, yet without sin..."
 - b. *Matthew* 4:1-11 Satan tempts Jesus...
 - c. *Matthew 26:37-39* tempted, yet submit's to the Father's will... Jesus perfection as a man was not due to His perfection as the Son of God, but rather because He chose to do what pleased the Father. Else, He could not be a sympathetic High Priest...

CONCLUSION

- 1. Jesus, made a little lower than the angels...
 - a. Jesus truly was 100 % man...
 - b. He endured temptation as we, yet remained sinless...
 - c. He qualifies as our High Priest before God...

HEAR THE VOICE OF THE LORD Hebrews 3

writer has established who the Lord is... -ch. 1 - 100 % God; ch. 2 - 100 % man

now impresses upon us the importance of heeding His voice...

already mentioned in 1:1-2; 2:1-4

now a whole chapter to that end...

COMPARED WITH MOSES (3:1-6)

A. Consider The Apostle And High Priest Of Our Confession (1-2)

- 1. <u>APOSTLE</u> {*apostolos*} delegate, messenger, he that is sent forth
- 2. High Priest noted in *ch.* 2 that Jesus is qualified... (more in *ch.* 5)
- 3. Moses also served in such a capacity...
 - a. Moses was faithful in serving God *Numbers 12:7*
 - b. Jesus was faithful *John 6:38; Hebrews 2:17*

B. Moses & Christ, serving before God (3-6)

- 1. Jesus is worthy of more glory...
 - a. Moses was leader of the nation Israel (note, God built it)
 - b. Jesus is leader & builder of the church, and is thus worthy of glory...
- 2. The Faithfulness of Christ...
 - a. Moses was faithful over Israel Hebrews 11
 - b. Jesus was faithful over the church, which He built...

We are His house, if we hold fast... - 1 Peter 2:4-5

HEAR THE VOICE OF THE LORD (3:7-15)

- A. David's Words, Psalm 95:7-11 (7-11)
 - 1. Note some things from the text:
 - a. "...IF..." hearing the voice of the Lord is our choice... (v 7)
 - b. We ought not harden our hearts, for then we are rebellious $(\nu 8)$
 - c. Rebellion is testing & trying of God... (y 9)
 - d. Rebellion will spark the wrath of God... (*v 9-10*)
 - e. Rebellious people have not know the way of God $(v \ 10)$
 - f. There is no rest for those who have rebelled... (v 11)

B. Beware Brethren (12-13)

- 1. Writer has just shown an example of God's people rebelling, Israel...
- 2. Again affirms the possibility of falling away from God...
- 3. The solution, *"...but exhort one another daily..."*
 - a. Encouragement is what will keep one faithful...
 - b. Sin cannot harden the heart of those who are continually exhorted...

C. Endurance Is Necessary (14-15)

- 1. "...we are partakers <u>IF</u> we hold...steadfast to the end..."
- 2. Again, the exhortation of David...
 - a. We are the ones who choose to hear...
 - b. We are the ones who choose to harden our hearts...

REBELLION OF THE NATION ISRAEL (3:16-19)

A. Israel Heard, Yet Rebelled (16)

- 1. Again affirms that one call fall from grace... —Israel did!!
- 2. God blessed Israel so bountifully...
 - a. Freedom from Egyptian oppression...
 - b. Provided for their needs in the wilderness...
 - c. Provided a promised land for them...
 - d. Yet, they rebelled...

B. God's Wrath Comes Upon Those Who Disobey Him (17)

- 1. The rebellion sparked the God's wrath... 40 yrs in wilderness...
 - a. None of that generation entered into the promised land...
 - b. Their rebellion was sin...

C. No Rest For The Disobedient (18-19)

- 1. Because of their disobedience, they would not enter the land...
- 2. Note the pattern in *16-19*
 - a. Heard \pm Rebelled (sinned) \pm God's anger \pm no rest...
 - b. Did not enter the land because of unbelief...
 - i. They that rebelled were guilty of unbelief....
 - ii. If one is a believer, then faithfulness falls in suit....

CONCLUSION

- 1. Hear the voice of the Lord...
 - a. Pharaoh "who is the Lord that I should heed His voice..."
 - He is the King of kings...
 - He is the Lord of lords...
 - He is the Redeemer of man...
 - He is the Creator of all...
 - He is the Saviour of man...
 - He is the Judge on the final day...
 - b. We must heed the voice of the Lord!!

ATTAINMENT OF REST Hebrews 4

ch. 3 expressed the necessity of hearing the voice of the Lord....

because of the disobedience & unbelief of Israel, they did not enter into rest (3:16-19) writer encourages us to consider ourselves in the light of the example of Israel....

1 Corinthians 10:11; Romans 15:4

THE PROMISE OF REST (4:1-10)

A. Since a promise remains of entering His rest (v 1)

- 1. We have a promise of rest *Matthew 7:21; John 14:1-3*
- 2. We must walk cautiously, lest we come short *Hebrews 2:1; Romans 11:20; 1 Corinthians 10:12*

B. But the word did not profit them (v 2-3)

- 1. The gospel message is the same *Galatians 3:8; Acts 13:46; 1 Peter 1:10-12; Romans 10:16*
- 2. It did not profit them Romans 10:17; Hebrews 3:12, 19; Hebrews 11:6
- 3. By faith we will enter His rest James 1:21; Matthew 11:28-29; Romans 5:1-2

C. The rest of God (*v* **4-10**)

- 1. Different rests spoken of
 - a. (v 4) God rested the seventh day... *Genesis 2:2; Exodus 20:11*
 - b. (v 8) The promised land of Canaan... Joshua 22:4
 - c. (v 9) The promised land of heaven... *Revelation 21:4*
- 2. (v 6) Will the generation which did not enter Canaan be in heaven? 3:18; 4:2
- 3. $(\nu 7)$ God's plea throughout time has been that people would enter His rest
- 4. One enters rest when work is done... (ie. day of work)
 - a. God worked 6 days & rested the 7^{th}
 - b. Israel worked in Egypt & came out to serve God, before going to rest
 - c. Jesus ascended to heaven after His work *Hebrews 1:3, 10:12*
 - d. We must work the works of God before we enter His rest...
- 5. (v 9)<u>**REST</u> {***sabbatismos***} only occurrence in the New Testament**</u>
 - a. A keeping Sabbath
 - b. The repose of Christianity; heaven

THE POWERFUL WORD OF GOD (4:11-13)

- A. Let Us Therefore Be Diligent (v 11)
 - 1. *Philippians 2:12; 2 Peter 1:10*
 - 2. We must give it our all... nothing greater than to enter His rest...
 - 3. *"...Lest..."* Again, the recognition that one can fall due to disobedience

B. The Word Of God Is Living... (v 12)

- 1. Scriptures affirm the power of the Bible *Romans 1:16; 1 Corinthians 1:18*
- 2. Living & powerful John 1:1, 14; 1 Peter 1:23; John 6:51
- 3. Sharper than any 2 edged sword 2 Corinthians 10:4-5; Acts 2:37; 5:33; Ephesians 6:17; Revelation 1:16; 2:16
- 4. Discerner of thoughts/intents *Psalm 139:2-4; 1 Samuel 16:7; 1 Chronicles 28:9*

C. All Things Open To The Eyes Of Him (v 13)

- 1. None of us are hidden from God *Psalm 33:13-15; Psalm 44:21; Proverbs 15:3; John 2:24*
- 2. Cannot hid sins *Psalm 90:8; 1 Corinthians 4:5; Ecclesiastes 12:13*
- 3. He is the judge *Ecclesiastes 12:14; Romans 2:16; 2 Corinthians 5:10*

HELP FOR TIME OF NEED (4:14-16)

- A. The Place Of The Great High Priest (v 14)
 - 1. Only Jesus is qualified to be our High Priest... *Hebrews 2:17*
 - 2. He has passed to the heavens *Hebrews 8:1; Hebrews 9:24; 10:12; Mark 16:19*
 - 3. Therefore, let us hold fast our confession *Hebrews 3:14; 10:23*

B. The Sympathy Of The Great High Priest (v 15)

- He is the sympathetic High Priest knows what we go through...
 - a. Isaiah 53:3-5; Philippians 2:7-8; Hebrews 2:17-18; Luke 4:2
 - b. Tempted as we are, yet without sin!

C. Our Access To The Throne, By The High Priest (v 16)

- 1. Because our High Priest has endured & now entered into the heavens, there is help for us....
- 2. We now have access to the throne of grace *Hebrews 10:19; Ephesians 3:12; Philippians 4:6*
- 3. We now can obtain mercy 1 Peter 2:10
- 4. We now can find grace to help in the time of need...

CONCLUSION

1.

- 1. God desires that we enter His rest. To do so, we must... Believe & obey His message with all diligence...
- 2. God's word is powerful...

living, powerful, discerner of thoughts/intents...

3. We have a High Priest who is in the heavens on our behalf...

He is sympathetic; we have access to the throne of grace...

We can now obtain mercy & help for the time of need...

APPOINTMENT OF A HIGH PRIEST

A. Appointed For Men.

- 1. The High Priest is a representative of men before God...
- 2. The priest offered both gifts & sacrifices for the people...

B. Compassionate.

- 1. Must have compassion for the ignorant (those who err through mistake)
- 2. He too is subject to weakness, subject to the same temptations...

C. Required To Bring Sacrifices For the People & Himself.

1. Brings sacrifice for sinners, himself included, for he too is a sinner...

D. None Became Priest On Their Own.

1. High Priest were called of God...

CHRIST, OUR HIGH PRIEST

A. Christ Did Not Glorify Himself

1. He did not take the position Himself, but was chosen by God...

B. "You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek..."

- 1. He was not of the order of Aaron...
- 2. He was to be an eternal royal priest... *Genesis* 14:18
- 3. refer to *Hebrews 7:1ff* for significance...

C. Jesus offering up prayers and supplication with tears...

- 1. *Matthew* 26:39, 42, 44
- 2. *Matthew* 25:53

D. Jesus, the Son of God learned by suffering.... — Philippians 2:8

- 1. He has been perfected... How? *Hebrews 2:10 "...through sufferings"*
- 2. Now the author of eternal salvation...
- 3. Again, Jesus has been called by God as High Priest...

Spiritual Immaturity Condemned

A. The Apostles Had Much To Say Concerning Jesus.

- 1. Hard to explain....
 - a. Not because the message is hard...
 - b. Because the hearers have become dull of hearing...

B. By This Time You Ought To Be Teachers.

- 1. By this time —sometime before the destruction of Jerusalem...
 - a. They have had sufficient time to now be teachers...
 - b. They need someone to again teach them the first principles...
- 2. Needing milk, not solid food... 1 Corinthians 3:1-3
- 3. Partakers of milk are unskilled... *1 Peter 2:2*

C. Solid Food Belongs To Those Who Are Mature.

- 1. Those who have their senses exercised to discern both good & evil.
 - a. By reason of use habit, continual practice...
 - b. We ought to be able to discern good & evil... *Romans 12:1-2*
 - i. The word of God gives the ability to discern...
 - ii. 1 Corinthians 2:16

CONCLUSION

2.

- 1. The High Priest Was Important
 - a. representative of the people....

 - b. We must grasp the first principles, that we can move on...
 - c. Might our desire and aim be to be fed with the meat of the word...

PROGRESSING IN CHRIST Hebrews 6

ch. 5 - God provides for our spiritual maturity....People to who letter was written had not progressed in the faith...We need to progress in the faith of Jesus Christ...

THE PERIL OF NOT PROGRESSING (1-8)

A. "....leaving the discussion of the elementary principles of Christ..."

- 1. Cannot grow on the first principles... *Hebrews 5:12-14; 2 Peter 2:2*
- 2. "...Let us go on to perfection..." teleiotes a state of more intelligence....
- 3. "...Not laying again the foundation..."
 - a. The insufficiency of the law & its works... (*Hebrews 9:14*)
 - b. The necessity of faith towards God... (*Hebrews 11:1, 6*)
 - c. The necessity for baptism into Christ... (*Acts 19:3-5*)
 - d. The laying on of hands....
 - e. The resurrection of the dead....
 - f. The judgment to come...
- 4. "...If God permits..." "...if the Lord wills..."

B. "...it is impossible...if they fall away to renew them again to repentance..."

- 1. Not because of God's lack of mercy, rather man's lack of repentance...
 - a. Apostates set a wall between themselves & the things of God...
- 2. "...Since they crucify again for themselves the Son of God..."
 - a. To return to sin is to trample the Son of God underfoot (10:29)

C. The Example Of The Earth...

- 1. Earth is blessed of God as it bears fruits which are good...
- 2. If it bears thorns & briers, it is rejected & cursed...

CONFIDENCE OF BETTER THINGS (9-12)

A. "...we are confident of better things concerning you..."

- 1. Harsh words needed to stir people up... 2 *Timothy 4:2; 1& 2 Corinthians*
- 2. Confident they will not bear thorns & briers....

B. "...God is not unjust to forget your work & labour of love..."

- 1. God doesn't throw away our good works...
- 2. Our works in His service are ever before Him...

- C. "...we desire that each one of you show the same diligence to the full assurance of hope..."
 - 1. Do not become sluggish...
 - 2. Imitate those who inherit the promises... *Hebrews 10:36*

ASSURANCE OF THE PROMISES OF GOD (13-20)

A. "...He could not swear by no one greater, He swore by Himself..."

- 1. None are greater than God... *Genesis* 22:16-17
- 2. Swore a promise to Abraham... he obtained after he had endured...

B. "...for men indeed swear by the greater, and an oath for confirmation is for them an end of all dispute..."

- 1. Men made oaths of the Lord... *Exodus 22:11*
 - a. An oath is binding...
 - b. It requires honouring the agreement made...
- 2. God confirmed His promise by an oath on Himself...
 - a. 2 immutable things: neither can be broken...
 - i. His word of promise...
 - ii. His oath...
 - b. God cannot lie, therefore, there is absolute assurance of His promise...

C. "...this hope we have as an anchor for the soul..."

song based on this verse...

- 1. Anchor a stay or safeguard...
 - a. Used to keep one in place...
 - b. Our hope is both sure & steadfast... It will not fail...

A. Melchizedek Was...

- 1. Appointed by the God to be both king of righteousness & peace...
- 2. *"...without father, without mother, without genealogy..."* not of tribe of Levi...
- 3. *"...having neither beginning of days nor end of life..."* perpetual priesthood...

B. Melchizedek, A Great Man...

- 1. Levites receive a tithe from brethren *Numbers 18:21*
- 2. Melchizedek received 1/10 from Abraham... (LEVITES THROUGH ABRAHAM)
- 3. *"...the lesser is blessed by the better..."* Abraham blessed by Melchizedek...
- 4. Priests here die, but Melchizedek lives forever in heaven...

THE NEED FOR A NEW PRIESTHOOD (7:11-19)

A. Perfection Was Not Of The Levitical Priesthood.

- 1. Need for a new priesthood & new law outside of Levi....

A. "...We have such a High Priest...."

- 1. He is not on the earth dwelling in tabernacles made by men...
- 2. He is a minister of the true tabernacle...

B. "...something to offer..."

- 1. Offered Himself.... *Ephesians 5:2*
- 2. Not a priest as those on the earth, of a different tribe/different priesthood...
- 3. They offer gifts according to the copy....
- 4. Copy & shadow of the heavenly things...

C. "...He has obtained a more excellent ministry..."

- 1. More excellent...
- 2. Provides hope, removes sin, purifies man....
- 3. Jesus only is the Mediator... 1 *Timothy 2:5*
- 4. Better covenant/ better sacrifices....

THE NEW COVENANT (8:7-13)

covenant - gr. diatheke {dee-ath-ay'-kay}

a disposition, arrangement, of any sort, which one wishes to be valid, the last disposition which one makes of his earthly possessions after his death, a testament or will contract, testament, agreement, promise, pledge, swear, treaty, oath, pact...

A. "...if that first covenant had been faultless..."

- 1. You don't repair what's not broken....
- 2. The first covenant was a broken covenant....
- 3. The new covenant was promised by the Lord v 8-12
- 4. Quoted from *Jeremiah 31:31-34*

B. "...I will put My laws in their mind and write them on their hearts..."

- 1. The new covenant is not merely a set of laws...
- 2. Judaism became a matter of strict keeping of the law....
- 3. Our hearts & minds must be given to the Lord *"…worship in spirit & truth…"*
- 4. Laws written on heart, not tablets of stone...

C. "...none of them shall teach his neighbor...brother..."

- 1. Old Testament born into the covenant relationship & then taught about it...
- 2. New Testament must learn about God & accept His ways before entering into the covenant relationship...

D. "...their lawless deed I will remember no more..."

- 1. In the old covenant, sins were not removed...
 - a. Man was still sinful before God....
 - b. No sacrifice was sufficient to remove sin...
- 2. Under the new covenant, God will forget our sins & unrighteousness...
 - a. We are able to appear before God righteous and holy....
 - b. A fit sacrifice has been made, Jesus Christ...

E. "...He made the first obsolete..."

- 1. **Obsolete...** gr. palaioo {pal-ah-yo'-o}
 - a. To make ancient or old
 - b. To become old, to be worn out
 - **c.** To declare a thing to be old and so about to be abrogated
 - d. Outdated, useless, of no effect, canceled, void......
- 2. The Old Testament covenant was to pass away...
 - a. Next chapter shows it did....
 - b. How much of the old covenant stayed?



- 1. Note the diagram....
 - a. The Holy Place —lampstand, table & showbread, etc.
 - b. The Most Holy Place —golden censer, ark of covenant...
- B. Cannot now speak in detail...
 - 1. They are the shadow, unimportant now...



The Tabernacle of the Old Covenant

SERVICE IN THE EARTHLY SANCTUARY (9:6-10)

Priests performed service in the Holy Place daily.... High priest performed service in the Most Holy Place once a year... Holy Spirit indicated that a way was not yet made manifest to the Holiest place....

A. ".it was symbolic..."- not the true & complete divine service....

- 1. "...gifts & sacrifices..." —symbols...
- 2. Could not make the worshipers *"...perfect in regard to the conscience..."*
- 3. Their sacrifices could not cleans them, but rather pointed to the perfect sacrifice which would save them...

B. "...being only (foods & drinks)...carnal ordinances..."

- 1. The old covenant & its sanctuary was carnal in its nature & service...
- 2. Various washings/cleansings...
- 3. These fleshly ordinances did nothing to cleanse the soul...

C. "...imposed until the time of reformation.."


- 1. These ordinances were not eternal...
- 2. They would be *"…until the time of reformation…"*
- 3. There were a temporary measure until the perfect covenant had come...

THE HEAVENLY SANCTUARY AND SERVICE (9:11-15)

A. "...greater & more perfect tabernacle...."

- 1. An heavenly sanctuary... created by God....
- 2. Blood of bulls & goats replaced with the blood of Jesus Christ...
 - a. Blood of bulls & goats purified the flesh in the Old Testament;
 - b. Blood of Christ is able to cleanse the soul in the New Testament...
- 3. Christ has entered into the Most Holy Place for all & remains there...
- 4. Jesus has become the Mediator of the new covenant...

THE NECESSITY OF HIS DEATH (9:16-22)

A. If there is a testament/will, there must be death of the testator/will writer....

- 1. No will/testament has any power until after the death of the testator...
- 2. Christ had to die before His will would be in force...
- B. The 1st covenant too was dedicated/begun with blood....
 - 1. Exodus 24:1-8

C. Without the shedding of blood there is no remission of sins...

1. No remission without the shedding of Christ's blood....

THE GREATNESS OF CHRIST'S SACRIFICE (9:23-28)

A. The new covenant has better sacrifices...

- 1. The earthly things (the copy) provided purification by the blood of bulls/goats, etc.
- 2. The heavenly (the true & everlasting covenant) required a better sacrifice than bulls/goats, etc. —Christ Himself...

B. Christ has not gone into the earthly Holy Place on our behalf, but into heaven itself...

- 1. He does not enter in once a year as the High priest of the old covenant to make sacrifice on our behalf...
- 2. He has not entered into the copy, but the true Holy Place...
- 3. "...He has appeared once to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself..."

C. Appointed for men to die once....

- 1. Men have only one life to live...
- 2. We live, we die, then the judgment...
- 3. As man only lives once, so also Christ was offered up once to bear sins...

D. He appeared the 1^{st} time for sin, He appears the 2^{nd} for salvation....

- 1. He came the first time to redeem man...
- 2. He came to be the sacrifice for sins...
- 3. He will come again, apart from sin for salvation...
- 4. Next time Jesus comes, it will be to take His people home...

CONCLUSION

- 1. We have a better sanctuary —an heavenly one....
- 2. We have a better sacrifice —the Son of God...
- 3. We have a better High Priest —Jesus Christ Himself...
- 4. We have a better covenant... —one established on better promises...

NOW DRAW CLOSE TO GOD & REMAIN CLOSE Hebrews 10

Continues to show the superiority of Christianity over Judaism to the reader... We are encouraged to draw close to God by faith, enduring in all things to the end...

THE INSUFFICIENCY OF ANIMAL SACRIFICES (10:1-4)

A. "For the law, having a shadow of the good things to come..."

- 1. A shadow Hebrews 8:5; 9:23; Colossians 2:17
- 2. The sacrifices of the law are imperfect... *Hebrews* 7:19; 9:9

B. "...would they not have ceased to be offered?"

- 1. Yet they did not cease...
- 2. They served as a reminder of sin...
- 3. The blood of bulls & goats could not remove sin...

PERFECTION FOUND IN THE SACRIFICE OF CHRIST (10:5-18)

- A. 'Sacrifice and offering You did not desire..."
 - 1. Psalms 40:6-8; Isaiah 1:11; Jeremiah 6:20; Amos 5:21-22
 - 2. God does not want heartless sacrifice of animals....
 - 3. *"I have come to do Your will..."* —Jesus' determined purpose...

B. "He takes away the first that He may establish the second."

- 1. Hebrews 8:7; 8:13
- 2. Sanctification is through the 2nd will...
 - a. **Sanctified** gr. hagiazo
 - i. To render to be hallowed..., to renew...
 - ii. To separate from profane things, dedicate to God...
 - iii. To consecrate, dedicate, purify, cleanse, free from guilt...
- 3. Mentioned in the Old Testament, but real meaning given in the new...

C. "...one sacrifice for sins forever..."

- 1. Priests offer sacrifices daily... He offered once for all time...
- 2. By one offering He perfected all the sanctified....
- 3. *"This is the covenant I will make with them..."*
- 4. "Their sins & their lawless deeds I will remember no more..."
- 5. **Psalms 103:12** illustrate...
- D. no longer an offering for sin... (v 2)

DRAW NEAR TO GOD IN KEEPING THE FAITH (10:19-39)

A. "...brethren, having boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus..."

- 1. Boldness; liberty; free and fearless confidence.....
- 2. We have access to the holiest place...
- 3. A concept entirely foreign to the Jew!!!
- 4. Access by the blood of Jesus; by a new and living way...
- *B. "…let us….let us….let us…."*
 - 1. "...LET US draw near to God...."(James 4:8)
 - a. "...with a true heart..." (Psalms 119:2, 80; Acts 8:21)
 - b. "...in full assurance of faith..." (Ephesians 3:12; James 1:6; 1 John 3:19)
 - c. "...having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience..." (Hebrews 9:14)
 - d. "...and our bodies washed with pure water." (1 Peter 1:2; 1 Corinthians 6:11; Ephesians 5:26; Titus 3:5; 1 Peter 3:21)
 - 2. "...LET US hold fast the confession of our hope...."(Hebrews 3:6, 14; 4:14; Revelation 3:11)
 - a. *"...without wavering..."(James 1:6)*
 - b. "...for He who promised is faithful." (Hebrews 6:18; 1 Corinthians 1:9; 10:13; Titus 1:2)
 - 3. "...LET US consider one another...."(Romans 12:15; 15:2; 1 Thessalonians 5:11)
 - a. *"...in order to stir up love and good works..."(Titus 3:8; 1 John 3:18)*
 - b. "...not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together..." (Acts 2:42; 20:7; Hebrews 3:13)

C. "...if we sin willfully...."

- 1. 2 types of sin
 - a. Sins of ignorance we sin unawares, unintentionally; mistakingly...
 - b. Sins of arrogance we sin willfully, fully knowing what we are doing is sinful, yet not caring...
 - i. The writer has already mentioned such sins *Hebrews* 6:4-6
 - ii. Moses warned the Jews about such sins *Deuteronomy* 17:12
 - iii. The apostle Peter warned of such sins -2 Peter 2:20-22
- 2. "...there no longer remains a sacrifice for sin..."
 - a. We have trampled the sacrifice of Christ underfoot...
 - b. We count His suffering on our behalf to be meaningless...
- 3. *"...but a certain fearful expectation of judgment..."*
 - a. Knowing that one's transgressions are wrong...
 - b. One who willfully sins certainly cannot expect anything else...
 - c. Hebrews 12:29; 2 Thessalonians 1:7-9; Revelation 20:15
- 4. Reject Moses & die without mercy, how much more they that reject Christ!!
 - a. *Vengeance is Mine, I will repay."....*
 - b. *"It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God."*

D. "...but recall the former days..."

- 1. Remember these brethren are in a time of weakness *Hebrews 5:12-14; 6:9*
- 2. Reminds them of struggles which they had endured *Galatians 3:3-4*
 - a. They joyfully accepted the plundering of their goods, for the hope of heaven...

E. "...do not cast away your confidence..."

- 1. Continue to be confident, bold...
- 2. Endurance is necessary...
- 3. *Habakkuk 2:3-4* He will come in a short time....
 - a. He has no pleasure in those that draw back....
- 4. We are not of those... (the writer includes himself with them)

CONCLUSION

Indeed, Judaism is insufficient to save...

One must come to Christ and be subject to His covenant to be saved....

Must obey & remain faithful...

Must endure to the end...

A PEOPLE OF FAITH Hebrews 11

faith — gr. pistis

THE NATURE OF FAITH (11:1-3)

- A. 'Now Faith Is The Substance Of Things Hoped For..."
 - 1. Substance a foundation; a firm standing place; confidence...
 - 2. No room for wavering. *James* 1:6; *Ephesians* 4:14
 - 3. Deals with reality, not vain fantasy *Hebrews 1:3*
 - 4. Everything in which the Christian has hope is tied back to faith....



B. "...The Evidence Of Things Not Seen..."

- 1. Evidence a proof, something by which things may be tested....
- 2. Cannot see God, but faith provides all that is necessary...
- 3. Do not see with bodily eyes, but with spiritual understanding...

C. "Through Faith We Understand That The Worlds Were Framed By The Word Of God..."

- 1. Answer to creation is found in Christianity...
- 2. Christian evidences... Genesis 1:1ff; Psalms 33:6; John 1:3; Romans 1:19ff

FAITH AT THE DAWN OF HISTORY (11:4-7)

- A. 'By Faith Abel Offered To God A More Excellent Sacrifice..."
 - 1. Abel did what was righteous... Genesis 4; 1 John 3:11-12; Titus 1:16
 - 2. *"...through it he being dead still speaks..."*
 - a. Revelation 14:13

B. "By Faith Enoch Was Taken Away..."

- 1. He did not taste death... John 8:51
- 2. "...he had this testimony, that he pleased God..."—Genesis 5:21-24; Romans 8:8

C. 'But Without Faith It Is Impossible To Please Him..."

- 1. Faith is essential... *Hebrews 3:12; Hebrews 4:2; John 8:24*
- 2. He is a rewarder... *Ruth 2:12; Matthew 5:12*

D. "By Faith Noah...Prepared An Ark...."

- 1. "...being divinely warned of things not yet seen..."
 - a. Floods not yet known... *Genesis 2:5; Genesis 6:17*
 - b. Noah received word of the flood well in advance...
- 2. "...moved with godly fear..."
 - a. He respected God... *Genesis 6:22; 7:5*
- 3. "...for the saving of his household..."
 - a. Obedience saved Noah *1 Peter 3:18-21*

FAITHFUL ABRAHAM (11:8-12)

A.

- A. "By Faith Abraham Obeyed When He Was Called To Go Out..."
 - 1. Became a sojourner *Genesis 12:1-4*)
 - 2. Note, *"...Abraham obeyed...*"

B. "By Faith He Dwelt In The Land Of Promise As In A Foreign Country...."

- 1. Did not receive the land of promise on earth...
- 2. Dwelt in the land in tents, wandering....
- 3. Abraham looked to the great city whose builder is God...

C. 'By Faith Sarah Herself Also Received Strength To Conceive Seed....'

- 1. A physical impossibility, with man... *Genesis* 18:11-14
- 2. Bore a son to Abraham *Genesis 21:1-2*
- 3. A great nation came from Abraham through the seed...

FAITH PROVIDES A BETTER HOMELAND (11:13-16)

- "...Not Having Received The Promises, But Having Seen Them Afar Off..."
 - 1. *"…not having not received…"* —promised land, great nation, blessings to all nations through his seed…
 - 2. "...but having seen them afar off..." —trusted God's promise...— John 8:56
 - a. "...they were persuaded of them..." Hebrews 6:17ff
 - b. *"...embraced them..."* —to grasp strongly as one's own...

- B. "...Confessed That They Were Strangers And Pilgrims On The Earth..."
 - 1. Wanderers in search of a homeland.... Ur of the Chaldeans??
- C. 'But Now They Desire A Better Country...'
 - 1. A 'BETTER'' country.... -3^{rd} world \pm G7 nations \pm Heaven!!!
 - 2. Therefore, God will call them His children...
 - 3. He has prepared a city for them... *Revelation 21 & 22; John 14:1-3*

FAITH OF THE PATRIARCHS (11:17-22)

A. Faith Of Abraham...

- 1. Abraham offered up Isaac.
 - a. No questions, just trusted God's will...
 - b. *Genesis 22*—see his obedience at the will of God...
- 2. Leaving Ur, his home to wander...
- 3. Received circumcision in his flesh...
- 4. Trusted God concerning the birth of Isaac
- 5. Pleaded with God on behalf of the city of Sodom...

B. Faith Of Isaac...

- 1. Isaac prophesied of the future concerning his sons...
- 2. A man blessed of the Lord *Genesis 26:29*
- C. Faith Of Jacob...
 - 1. Jacob in his dying hours focused on spiritual things...
 - 2. His service for Leah & Rachel. *Genesis 29*
 - 3. Prosperity in the field *Genesis 30*

D. Faith Of Joseph...

- 1. *Genesis 50:24-25* —believed earnestly that God would free Israel...
- 2. Sold into slavery, served in Egypt, provided for the his father's household..

 - 1. Decree —all male children born to be put to death... *Exodus 1:22*

B. "...Refused To Be Called The Son Of Pharaoh's Daughter...."

- 1. Could have had all riches & pleasures he ever desired...
- 2. *"...Chose rather to suffer..."* —uncommon/illogical...
- 3. "...Passing pleasure of sin..."
 - a. Egypt offered temporary happiness...
 - b. God offers eternal happiness
- 4. "...the reproach of Christ..." —Romans 8:18
- 5. He looked to the reward *Philippians 3:7ff*

C. "...Forsook Egypt..."

- 1. Not fearing the wrath of the King... *Matthew 10:28*
- 2. Enduring as seeing... *Hebrews 11:1*

D. "...Kept The Passover..."

- 1. Moses & Israel...
- 2. Believed the power of God & the wrath to be brought...

E. "...They Passed Through The Red Sea..."

- 1. Believed God could and would do it... —passed as by dry land...
- 2. Egyptians did not know God, thus drowned..

 - 1. Down cast @ first Judges 6:13
 - 2. Promise of the Lord Judges 6:14
 - 3. Army of 300 *Judges* 7
 - 4. A great work of God! *Judges 7:22*
- D. Barak Judges 4:1-24 God delivered Sisera & his armies into his hands.
 - 1. Israel did evil in God's sight Judges 4:1

- 2. "...If you endure chastening, God deals with you as with sons..."
 - a. Heed His word, mold to His ways, He considers you a son...
- 3. 'If you are without chastening...then you are illegitimate and not sons."
 - a. Reject His word, walk in own paths, He considers you an outcast.

B. "...We have had human fathers who corrected us..."

- 1. "...we paid them respect..."
 - a. *Exodus 20:12; Proverbs 30:17* Honour your father and your mother...
 - b. *Ephesians 6:1-2; Colossians 3:20* —must obey father and mother...

- 2. "...shall we not much more...be in subjection to the Father of spirits..."
 - a. James 4:7, 10; 1 Peter 5:6 submit selves to God...
- 3. "...for they...chastened us as seemed best..., but He for our profit...holiness"
 - a. Father's bring up children as best they can...

 - a. *"...as if chained with them..."* —have great compassion....
 - b. Endure with them Galatians 6:2; 1 Corinthians 12:26; Romans 12:15

 - c. "At the date of this epistle, James the brother of John, and "James the brother of our Lord", both so closely connected with the Jerusalem church, had suffered martyrdom. The last named, whose martyrdom is recorded by Josephus, was put to death in A.D. 63."
 - d. "...whose faith follow..." —1 Corinthians 11:1
 - e. *"...considering the outcome of their conduct..."* —heavenly home...

2. 'Jesus Christ is the same...'

- a. Comfort for those who serve God. He is unchanging...
- b. Same yesterday, today & forever.
 - i. Power, love, faithfulness, etc.
- 3. "Do not be carried about with various and strange doctrines..."
 - a. Warning to remain steadfast in the truth.
 - b. Ephesians 4:11-16; Matthew 24:24; Acts 20:30; Galatians 1:6; Colossians 2:8
 - c. Encourages them to be established in grace, not the law.

B. Christianity Excels Over Judaism

1. *"We have an alter..."*

- a. Our alter consists in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ...
- b. Those who cling to tabernacle service have no right to it...
- 2. Our great sacrifice.
 - a. Old Testament sacrifices, blood brought to the mercy seat, body & entrails burned outside the camp, for it was a sacrifice for sin/accursed thing.
 - b. Jesus, that He might atone for our sins was led outside the gate, and sacrificed as an accursed thing.
 - c. *"...let us go forth to Him, outside the camp..."*
 - d. Outside of unbelieving Israel...
- 3. "For here we have no continuing city..."
 - a. The temple & Jerusalem (their city of origin) were about to be destroyed!
 - b. They were pilgrims seeking a city, even as their fathers. (*Hebrews* 11:13-16)

C. Serving Before The Lord

- - a. Jesus has been the blood sacrifice, no longer do that continually.
 - b. Now the continual sacrifice is that of praise from our lips...
- 2. "...do not forget to do good and to share..."
 - a. Certainly praising God is necessary, & to be continual, but we cannot forget that there is a practical/work side of our service before Him.
 - b. We must be about good works. *Titus 2:14, 3:8, 3:14, etc.*
 - c. We must share our goods *1 Timothy 6:18-19*

D. Submit To The Shepherds Of The Flock

- 1. *'Obey those who rule over you...''*
 - a. Be subject to the elders. 1 *Timothy 5:17; 1 Peter 5:1-5*
- 2. "...for they watch out for your souls..."
 - a. They are spiritual leaders who care for the flock *Acts 20:28*
- 3. *"...as those who must give account..."*
 - a. They must give an account of what they have done 2 *Corinthians* 5:10
- 4. *"Let them do so with joy..."*
 - a. Do not make their job grievous...
 - b. Unprofitable for you... —discipline, etc.

PRAYER REQUESTS AND FAREWELL (13:18-25)

- A. Prayer Requests —Paul often made request of brethren for prayers.
 - 1. "...we are confident that we have a good conscience..."
 - a. Refers to upright living, possibly due to being arrested in Jerusalem as an evildoer. *Acts 21:33; 24:5*
 - 2. "...that I may be restored to you..."
 - a. Language implies that the writer is in prison...
- B. Final Words
 - 1. "...may the God of peace...make you complete in every good work..."
 - a. Only in Him & following Him are we complete.
 - b. Need to allow Him to work in us...*Philippians 2:13*
 - 2. *"...bear with the word of exhortation..."*
 - a. Listen to and accept the words of this letter.
 - i. Nature of Christ.
 - ii. Superiority of Christ
 - iii. Need to have active obedience to the word of God.
 - iv. Superiority of Christianity over Judiasm.
 - v. Need for them to progress in faith.
 - vi. Examples of the faithful.
 - vii. Admonition to receive the chastening of the Lord.

- 3. *"...Timothy has been set free..."*
 - a. Timothy apparently arrested. No record in history besides this.
 - b. Timothy joined Paul in Rome. Note salutations of so-called 'prison epistles''
 - c. *Philippians 1:1; Colossians 1:1; Philemon 1:1*

4. *'Greet all...'*

- a. Greet the elders, and all the saints in Jerusalem/Judea.
- b. Those from Italy greet you. (Rome, Italy)
